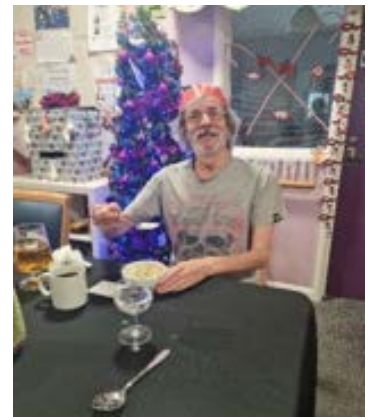
Here at The Hollies, we would like to welcome all readers old and new to our newsletter. We have been having lots of fun and made lots of memories that we would like to share with you all.
